Note to Mr. Cummings: We need Senator Grassley himself to read and respond to this letter and sign his response with his own hand.

Dear Senator Grassley,

Thank you for having one of your aides respond to our recent legal opinion letters on federal income tax laws (attached), and for the prompt reply (attached). The response letter we received stated that you value our input and asked us to keep in touch, which we appreciate.

The letter from your office stated that "Many individuals and groups have raised similar arguments in the past as to why they believe they do not need to comply with federal tax laws." However, we were writing you to **make sure** that **we are complying** with federal tax laws and paying our fair share!

The form letter with your computer signature also referred us to the IRS website. As you know, the executive branch, including the IRS, does not write tax laws; Congress, the legislative branch, does that. In our letters we asked for **your** response to our specific legal authorities, which are solidly based on the official sources of the federal tax laws, U.S. Treasury regulations, and U.S. Supreme Court decisions that were attached to our petition letters to you.


You took an oath to support and defend the U.S. Constitution "against all enemies, foreign and domestic." Passing these important issues to the IRS would be an abdication of your responsibility as a lawmaker to specifically address our <u>serious questions</u> about tax laws that are made by Congress.


If you do not personally address our questions specifically, you will be knowingly and intentionally violating your oath of office.

We are confident that you do take your oath seriously, and that likely you never even saw or read our letters. Instead, probably one of your aides looked at our letters and sent to us that canned response with your computer scanned signature imprinted on it.

This responsibility to address our tax law questions is even heavier on you, since you are a senior member (and past chairman) of the Senate Finance Committee, also serving on the Taxation and IRS Oversight Committee.

Therefore, we are once again asking you to address our letters personally, although you are free and encouraged to seek the assistance of the Congressional Research Service in assessing our legal points and authorities.
